Neighborhood Watch (NW) is one of the oldest and most effective crime prevention programs in the country, bringing citizens together with local law enforcement to make our community safer. Neighborhood Watch volunteers organize to prevent crime in our neighborhoods, through increased awareness and participation in personal safety & security and strengthening neighborhood ties by getting to know their neighbors. Sun City Lincoln Hills (SCLH) is divided by villages. Each village has numbered mailbox stations. Neighborhood Watch Volunteers serve as **Mailbox Captains** assigned a mail station in their neighborhood, **Coordinators** are assigned a village and **Directors** are assigned a specific group of villages.

ALERTS



Alerts are “FYI” or public safety informational emails based on incidents within Sun City Lincoln Hills and police reports that impact our community. Although each resident is encouraged to sign-up to receive their own Alerts, Mailbox Captains will forward Alerts to their residents. To sign-up for Alerts, go to sclhwatch.org and click *Add me to Alerts*. An email message will appear - just click Send; no message necessary. Your email address will be added to the Alerts list. INCIDENTS

Neighborhood Watch encourages residents to be the eyes and ears of the Lincoln Police and Fire Department. If you “see something, say something” – to report incidents visit the SCLHWatch.org homepage and click **“REPORT AN INCIDENT”**.

VIAL OF LIFE

This program encourages individuals to have their complete medical information readily available for EMS to reference during an emergency. Your Mailbox Captain will provide you with a Vial of Life “kit” and instructions on how to complete the Vial of Life forms. Wearable devices help seniors live independently while staying safe and connected. These tools offer health monitoring, emergency support, and peace of mind for both users and their loved ones.

- **Simple Interface:** Large icons, voice commands, easy navigation
- **Long Battery Life:** Reduces need for frequent charging
- **Comfortable Design:** Discreet, wearable styles
- **Social Connectivity:** Video calls and voice commands
- **Caregiver App:** Real-time updates and alerts for family

Neighborhood Watch encourages all residents to complete a Vial of LIFE (Lifesaving Information For Emergencies) for First Responders to your home. However, how would you communicate your medical information and emergency contacts when out and about?

YOUR MOBILE PHONE, EVEN WHEN LOCKED, COULD BE YOUR LIFELINE.

Whether you have an Android or an iPhone, settings can allow the sharing of your medical and emergency contacts information visible on your locked phone.

WHEN OUT & ABOUT how can others view your vital information in case of an emergency? Your Allergies? Medications? Current health issues? Emergency contacts? Pet information?

FIRST: Enter your medical ID information and set up your ICE "in case of emergency" contacts according to your phone's user guide.

SECOND: Learn how to view emergency information on any locked phone.

Both iPhone and Android phones have dedicated settings for displaying this vital information. If your phone does not have this option, add "ICE" in front of a contact's name, i.e. "ICE – Son" before your Son's name. This entry allows emergency responders or hospital staff to quickly call your ICE contact *and* provide them with the contact's relationship to you.

HELP FIRST RESPONDERS HELP YOU- INSTALL A LOCKBOX



Fast Access. Less Damage. More Peace of Mind.

A lockbox gives emergency personnel secure access to your home when you're unable to open the door. It's a simple, affordable tool that can make a life-saving difference—ensuring faster, safer access during emergencies.

KEY BENEFITS

- **Faster Emergency Response**
First responders can enter immediately without forcing entry—saving critical time during medical or fire emergencies.
- **Reduced Property Damage**
Avoid broken doors or windows. A lockbox allows safe entry without costly repairs that may not be covered by insurance.
- **Peace of Mind**
Ideal for seniors, individuals with medical conditions, or those living alone. Know help can reach you quickly when needed.
- **Supports Medical Alert Systems**
If you're unable to reach the door, responders can use the lockbox to enter and assist you.
- **Minimizes Water Damage in Fires**
Firefighters can quickly access your home to shut off sprinkler systems, helping reduce water damage.

LOCKBOX INSTALLATION TIPS

- Mount the lockbox near your **front door** or **main entry point**
- Ensure it is **clearly visible** and **no higher than 6 feet** from the ground
- Use a **secure surface** and follow manufacturer instructions
- Choose a **weather-resistant model** for outdoor use

REGISTER YOUR LOCKBOX, KEYLESS ENTRY AND ALARM



Residents of **Lincoln, CA** can register their devices (lockbox/keyless Entry/Alarm) with the **Lincoln Police Department** to ensure first responders have access when needed. This will only be used when residents are unable to open the door.

- **Registration is voluntary and free**
- Your device **code and location** are kept **private**

Don't Let a Fall Be Your Wake-Up Call



HOME SAFETY CHECKLIST

Simple changes can help prevent falls and injuries—especially for seniors or those with mobility challenges.

Use this checklist to find and fix hazards in your home. Walk through each room and check off items to improve safety and peace of mind.

GENERAL SAFETY

- Keep objects off the stairs and floors
- Pick up clutter to keep walkways clear
- Coil or tape cords and wires next to walls
- Keep frequently used items on lower shelves
- Use a step stool with a hand bar—never use a chair

LIGHTING

- Place a lamp close to the bed
- Install nightlights in hallways and bathrooms
- Use light switches that glow in the dark
- Have an overhead light and switch at the top and bottom of stairs
- Ask someone to help change hard-to-reach bulbs

STAIRS

- Fix loose or uneven steps
- Make sure carpet is firmly attached or use non-slip treads
- Ensure handrails are secure and on both sides of the stairs

BATHROOM

- Use non-slip mats or strips in the tub or shower
- Install grab bars next to the toilet and inside the tub/shower

RUGS & FLOORING

- Remove loose rugs or secure them with double-sided tape or non-slip backing

We have volunteer positions for: Information and Referral, who take in calls from residents and determine the need; Medical Equipment Loan Program (ME), who manage the equipment and deliver it to those who need it; Handy Helpers (HH) who perform in-home tasks like those listed above and Dispatchers, who sent out ME or HH.
